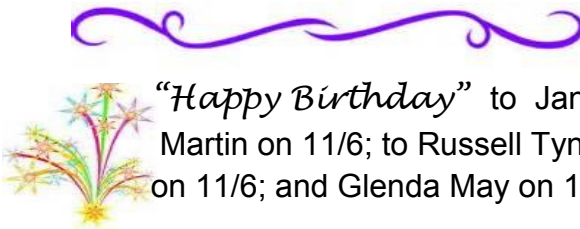


Remember in Prayer

After grabbing some basics, we thought we would grab what would be our only hot meal for the next few days. The only problem was that all the restaurants were shutting down in anticipation of the weather. Only one place was open, so we went inside to get something. That was a mistake.

I don't know if it was always this way or they just knew they had a captive audience but the only thing on the menu was lasagna, for forty five dollars! No sides, no salad, no bread, just lasagna. Now it wasn't bad lasagna but for forty five dollars I was expecting it to be the best thing I ever ate. It wasn't. I look back and think that was probably the most expensive food I ever purchased.
