The Faithfulness of Jesus (Part 1)

"Wherefore, holy brethren, partakers of the heavenly calling, consider the Apostle and High Priest of our profession, Christ Jesus; who was faithful to him that appointed him, as also Moses was faithful in all his house. For this man was counted worthy of more glory than Moses, inasmuch as he who hath built the house hath more honour than the house. For every house is built by some man; but he that built all things is God. And Moses verily was faithful in all his house, as a servant, for a testimony of those things which were to be spoken after; But Christ as a son over his own house; whose house are we, if we hold fast the confidence and the rejoicing of the hope firm unto the end." (Hebrews 3:1-6). Consider Christ Jesus who is the Apostle and High Priest of our profession. Jesus was sent by the Father to do His will, and He always did this; He was always faithful to the Father (John 6:38, John 8:29). A high priest is one who mediates between God and man; he represents to each party the needs of the other. Jesus is the perfect and faithful high priest(Hebrews 2:17). Jesus also knows the perfection and demands of a holy and just God, and is able to satisfy God's demand for justice (Romans 3:25-26). Jesus is faithful to both God and man. His faithfulness moves heaven and earth to place our faith and trust in Him. How faithful was Jesus? He was as faithful as Moses, but what is the significance of that comparison? In Hebrews 3:2, the Holy Spirit alludes to Numbers 12:7 where God speaks directly to Aaron and Miriam who were challenging Moses' place of authority. In the context, God was answering a question about how he would communicate with the children of Israel. He said that he would communicate to the prophets by dreams and visions (Numbers 12:6), but He would not so communicate with Moses. Instead, God would speak to Moses "mouth to mouth" (Numbers 12:8). Moses' special relationship with God was due to his faithfulness. (Numbers 12:7). God's affirmation of His special relationship with Moses demonstrated the superiority of that relationship in comparison with everyone else in Israel, especially, in this context, Aaron and Miriam. For Jesus to be as faithful as Moses means that Jesus has at least the same special status as Moses: God's mouth piece—but the Holy Spirit takes us further. Hebrews 3:3 says that Jesus was counted worthy of more glory than Moses. First, Jesus is the one who built the house of Moses. It is a self-evident truth that the one who builds the house has more honor than the house itself, and especially in this case since God is the one who built all things. The implication is that Jesus is God, which is also reason number two as to why Jesus has more honor than Moses. Third, while Moses was a servant, Jesus is a Son. This means that He is not just a household functionary, but the heir—One with the right to rule over the house. Moses was a servant in the house; Jesus is the Son over the house. In these three clear ways, the Holy Spirit demonstrates the superiority of Jesus to Moses. **Kevin Cauley**
