Offending and Being Offended (Part 3)

We may sometimes avoid offending others, but some offenses cannot be avoided. Christians will offend some people simply because they are Christians. Paul wrote, "Yes, and all who desire to live godly in Christ Jesus will suffer persecution" (2 Timothy 3:12). Why would the godly be persecuted? Isaiah 5:20 states, "Woe to those who call evil good, and good evil; Who put darkness for light, and light for darkness; Who put bitter for sweet, and sweet for bitter!" In such a sinful environment, we will offend others because they love darkness more than they love light (John 3:19).

Paul said preaching the gospel offends some people. Consider 1 Corinthians 1:23, "but we preach Christ crucified, to the Jews a stumbling block and to the Greeks foolishness." The Greek word for "stumbling block" yields our English word "scandalous." A scandal is a great offense! The Jews were offended by Jesus. Many are offended by the teaching and preaching of the gospel because the gospel confronts their pride and condemns it.

Even Jesus offended people when telling them the truth (Matthew 13:57, 15:12). At one point. He even offended his own disciples (John 6:61)! Did Jesus apologize for telling the truth? In Matthew 15:12, after his disciples told him that the Pharisees had been offended, he said, "Every plant, which my heavenly Father hath not planted, shall be rooted up. Let them alone: they be blind leaders of the blind. And if the blind lead the blind, both shall fall into the ditch" (Matthew 15:13-14). We must preach the truth in love (Ephesians 4:15), but the Christian ought not to be primarily concerned about offending someone as he is teaching or preaching the truth. It is a prideful spirit that takes offense at truth, but truth needs to offend our pride in order for lives to be changed.


