Why Make Sacrifices (Part 4)?

We make sacrifices to show our love for our fellow human. Certainly God showed His love for us when He gave His Son (John 3:16, Romans 5:8-9). The apostle John recognized this when he wrote, "Herein is love, not that we loved God, but that he loved us, and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins" (1 John 4:10). Presaging his own death, Jesus said, "Greater love hath no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends" (John 15:13). Certainly Jesus demonstrated His own love for His fellow man when he sacrificed His life, and in 1 John 4:11, John wrote, "Beloved, if God so loved us, we ought also to love one another." Notice the little word "so" in this verse. It is an adverb of manner. The emphasis is upon how God loved us. That is the kind of love we should have for one another. Making sacrifices shows our love for one another.

Making sacrifices shows our love for ourselves as well. One might ask, "How does it do that?" It does that by helping us to realize that we are not mere animals and earthly beings. We have a tendency to identify with the physical things around us. When we do that, we get caught up in the possession of those things and lose who we really are. Sacrificing those things to God affirms our true self and nature and helps us to depend upon God for our identity instead of this world. Paul put it like this, "I have been crucified with Christ. It is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me. And the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me" (Galatians 2:20).



will before God's. With an imprecatory petition, he says, "Let those be ashamed and humiliated together who seek my life to destroy it; let those be turned back and dishonored who delight in my hurt." He asks that embarrassment and disgrace fall upon his enemies so that they will cease their evil intentions and works. These foes are

probably national enemies who hated David, Israel, and God. They ridicule God's people with words of contempt. He prays that they might in turn receive the same treatment. In derision they are laughing at his trouble; so he prays, "Let those be appalled because of their shame who say to me, "Aha, aha!" They have said, "Look at him and his men. He is supposed to be strong and have a powerful God, but look at how weak he is!" He prays that God will powerfully change their plans so that they will recognize God and praise Him.

The writer follows his prayer for God to deal with His enemies with a strong affirmation of his faith in God: "You are my help and my deliverer; do not delay, O my God" (v. 17).

Key Thought: When Peter and John were persecuted, they prayed a much different prayer: "And now, Lord, take note of their threats, and grant that Your bond-servants may speak Your word with all confidence, while You extend Your hand to heal, and signs and wonders take place through the name of Your holy servant Jesus" (Acts 4:29, 30).
