Truth is Granular

One of the lessons that I taught in logic class was the nature of contradiction. True contradictions are rare because they depend upon very specific details conflicting with each other. For example, suppose someone came running into the building and said that there was basketball size hail coming down outside. We would immediately think about the weather. Was it sunny when we walked in? Cloudy? What was the temperature like? Did the forecast even call for a storm? Some might panic and start running to get their cars under cover. What would we do when we looked out the window and discovered that it wasn't hailing at all? We would turn to the crier and brand him a liar! He might then say, "But I meant that it hailed in Vivian, South Dakota, July 23, 2010." The time and place make all the difference.

Sometimes we overgeneralize and jump to conclusions. This is a bad practice. We must remember that truth is granular, and circumstances may be different between one person and the next. Jesus told us not to judge according to appearances but to judge righteously (John 7:24). This means that we listen carefully to what a person has to say, ask a lot of questions, and then wait for more information before rushing to judgment. When we overgeneralize and jump to conclusions the consequences can be embarrassing for us because we will have to admit to being wrong. Jumping to conclusions can also cause division where there need not be any, and we don't want to do that. Proverbs 18:13 says, "He who answers a matter before he hears it, It is folly and shame to him." Let's seek to be precise in our words and actions.

Website Report for 2018

The year 2018 was a record year for our website. We broke our all-time daily record for pageviews. We also broke our record for number of countries that visited our website. This is great news because it means that we are preaching the gospel in places where we would not be able to otherwise. Here are a few statistics from 2018. We published 335 pages of content for a total page content of 955. We had 11,810 visitors to our website. They viewed our pages 33,567 times. These pages are sermon outlines, bulletin articles, and videos of our worship services. We were up over 4000 visitors from 2017 and over 7000 pageviews from 2017.

We had visitors from 117 different countries in 2018. That is up from 99 countries in 2017; we got visitors from an additional 18 countries! Here are some highlights. We had 595 pageviews from the Philippines, 500 from India, 281 from Ghana, 273 from South Africa, 211 from Saudi Arabia, 158 from Thailand, 74 from Indonesia, 71 from China, and 57 from Singapore. We also had visitors from some middle-eastern countries: Saudi Arabia, United Arab Emirates, Kuwait, Egypt, Qatar, Pakistan, and Syria.

This means that we are fulfilling the Great Commission to take the gospel to the world. This is YOUR work for the Lord, because you are funding the tools, techies, and teachers involved in this work. A website that hosts hundreds of pages with multimedia content (like our website) can cost up to \$40,000 a year (https://digital.com/blog/how-much-does-website-cost/), and the average website-developers' salary is \$74,110 a year (https://money.usnews.com/careers/best-jobs/web-developer/salary). Our website is developed and maintained in house, so we only pay \$19 each month to have a professional quality website. To put it in terms that we are familiar with, that is equivalent to handing out 33,567 tracts at a cost of about ½ cent per tract in 117 different countries. This is a GREAT work!
