The Appeal of Eternal Life

On June 2, I preached a lesson on “The Invitation,” explaining how that God’s appeal to men is universal in scope, but largely rejected as men refuse to turn from sin. I emphasized that the God’s offer to men is eternal life. Subsequently, I have reflected that I did not discuss the *appeal* of eternal life. On this subject, Scripture instructs and reminds us:

		Here	Beyond this Life
Appeal of Eternal Life by contrast with this life.	Comfort	In this life, we have no lasting comfort , only renewed or constant need. (Proverbs 30:15f)	Immediately after death, we read of Lazarus carried to Abraham’s Bosom, where he was comforted . (Luke 16)
	Immortality	In time, our bodies wear out. (Ecc. 12) Injuries and disease break them down.	This is “changed”(1 Cor 15:40, 44; 1 John 3:2). Spiritual body is raised, distinctly different from the physical, and incorruptible .
	Peace	The will of man often conflicts with the will of God (Mat 6:10f; 18:1-4; Jas 1:14f)	After the Judgment (Mat 25; Rev 21:8; 2 Cor 5:10; Heb 9:27), all present in Heaven are of one accord
	Strength	The laws of toil and weariness in this life drag on. (Gen 3:16-17)	Mortal shall put on immortality (1 Cor 15:53)
	Victory	We can only <i>believe in</i> the complete and final victory of Right and Justice.	We will have seen the Victory and been part of it. (Revelation)
	Corruption	Moth and rust do corrupt. Thieves break in and steal. (Mat 6:19f)	Real treasure lies incorruptible, protected by God Himself. (Col 3:1-2)
	Rest	Likened to the wilderness wanderings of the Israelites in the Old Testament (Hebrews 3-4) Much “unrest”	Great contrast of entering into “rest” (Mat 11:28-30) and “joy” set before us (Heb 12:2)
	Security	We look for a city (habitation close to God) and a lasting inheritance (Heb 11:8-10)	Granted inheritance (Mat 25) prepared by God (John 14:1-3; Heb 11:16)

While we are living and working here and now, we are looking to be changed, transported, and received unto life eternal. Persevering by trust in the Lord brings many benefits! (1 Cor 15:58; 1 Thes 4:18) jp
