## Jesus: the Son of God

Jesus is described as "the Son of God" about 30 times in Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. Mark's account begins, "The beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God" (Mark 1:1). Demons, or unclean spirits, are recorded as using this phrase in addressing Jesus (Mark 3:11; 5:7). Peter confessed of Jesus, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God" (Matt 16:16). Jesus acknowledged the truth of Peter's words (Matt 16:17). Jesus declared that he was the Son of God to a healed man who had been born blind (John 9:35-38). A centurion who witnessed the events connected with the cross concluded "Truly this man was the Son of God!" (Mark 15:37-39 cf. Matt 27:54).

What does this phrase mean? It depends on the context. This phrase is used in different ways in scripture. (1) Sons of God is used of angels, or heavenly beings, it seems (Job 2:1). Perhaps, this is because they are God's creation (cf. Psalm 148:1—5; Neh 9:6; Col 1:16). Another possible explanation is that they are so called because they serve God. (2) Son of God is used of Adam (Luke 3:38). He is called this, because he was created by God, not having an earthly father preceding him. (3) Israel is called by God "My Son" (Exo 4:22). This is likely a reference to relationship, and care. (4) Kings who came through the Davidic seed line are sons of God (2 Sam 7:12-16). This is also likely a reference to relationship and care. (5) Those in authority are called, "children of the Most High" (Psa 82:6). This is likely a reference to authority and position allowed by God on this earth (e.g. Exo 7:1-2, Exo 22:28; Eze 31:11). (6) Christians are called "sons of God" (cf. 1 John 3:1-2; Gal 3:26-28). The reference is to being a part of God's spiritual family and heirs of the good things to come (Rom 8:17).

**What Repentance is Not *continued* (part 3)**

4) *Repentance is not merely admitting, or confessing, that one is a sinner.* It is hard to get men to say, "I have sinned." It is a step in the right direction. The publican admitted he was a sinner. (Lk. 18:9-14). The Jews on Pentecost admitted the same. (Acts 2:37,38). However, the Pentecostians are an excellent example of the fact that mere admission of sin, in and of itself, is not repentance; for, after they had admitted their sin (vs. 37), Peter still told them to repent. (vs. 38). Judas confessed he had sinned (Matt. 27:3-5); but went out and hanged himself, Eleven men in the Bible said, "I have sinned." Saul (next to David) said it more than any other man. Yet, it did him little good. One might admit that he is an alcoholic, but of what value is this unless he earnestly tries to overcome his fault? Conviction of sin is most necessary, but such in and of itself is not repentance. Agrippa was convicted, but he did not repent. (Acts 26:28). The same is true of the rich young ruler. (Matt. 19:16-22).


5) *Repentance is not just being fearful and afraid.* Fear is important (Eccl. 12:13; Rom 3:18); but such in and of itself is not repentance. The devils believe and tremble. (Jas 2:19). Felix trembled; but, he never genuinely repented. (Acts 24:25). The jailor prostrated himself in fear (Acts 16:29-34); but at this point he had not repented. Two men were caught in a squall and began to make great promises to the Lord. One of them stopped and told the other to be careful what he was promising and not go too far; for, he said, "I see land in sight." They were fearful, but they had not genuinely repented. Often so-called penitential crying is only hypocritical lying.
