The status quo --a life of ease

The New Testament shows us some of what life was like in the first century for Christians. We ought to have our expectations of ourselves formed first after Christ's example, then that of the apostles and other early Christians. Zeal and enthusiasm for seeing things the way they ought to be may wane over time, but the renewing of mind for the Christian (Rom 12) helps keep us "fresh in the fray" against the worldliness around us every day.

We should refuse to rationalize--to apply unfit standards. Seriously looking at the spread of the Gospel and what was done in the book of Acts helps us digest how we ought to behave ourselves. The apostles and other early Christians suffered in order to spread the Gospel. They also suffered at the hands of violent and hostile reactionaries. However, they persevered, clinging to the promises of God. In 2 Timothy 3, Paul was concerned that Timothy behave himself in a godly, consistent, productive way. He was interested in conveying to (and reminding) the young preacher some of the generalities of expectations of life as a disciple of Christ. Included here are a few of his words:

But thou hast fully known my doctrine, manner of life, purpose, faith, longsuffering, charity, patience,

Persecutions, afflictions, which came unto me at Antioch, at Iconium, at Lystra; what persecutions I endured: but out of them all the Lord delivered me. Yea, and all that will live godly in Christ Jesus shall suffer persecution.

But evil men and seducers shall way worse and worse, deceiving, and being

But evil men and seducers shall wax worse and worse, deceiving, and being deceived.

But continue thou in the things which thou hast learned and hast been assured of, knowing of whom thou hast learned them;

And that from a child thou hast known the holy scriptures, which are able to make thee wise unto salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus.

All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness:

That the man of God may be perfect, throughly furnished unto all good works. (2 Tim 3:10-16)

Only by watering this down, deluding ourselves, and searing our consciences can Christians arrive at a conclusion that we're okay if we have "gone along to get along" in life. God gives us His excellent standard (James 1:22-25).
