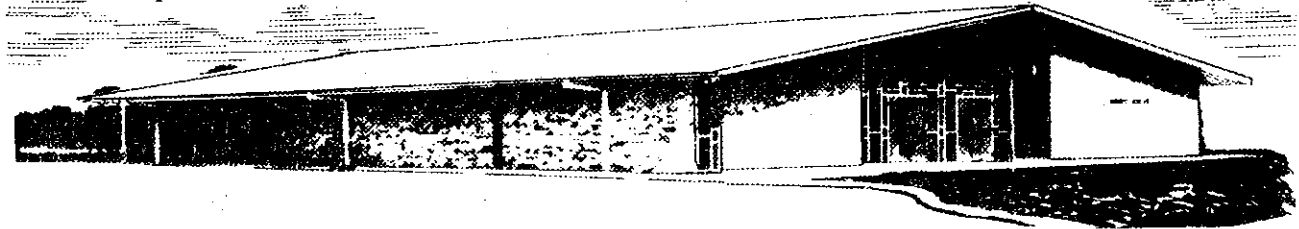


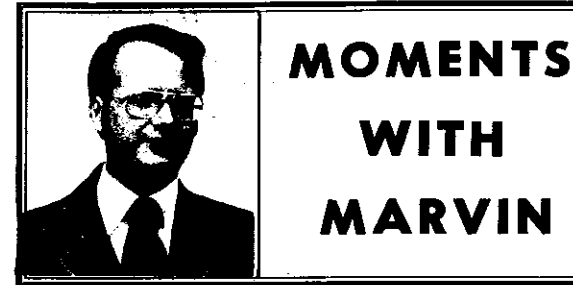

A TIME TO REMEMBER

"And he said unto him, if they hear not Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded, if one rise from the dead" (Luke 16:30).

The story is well known. A poor beggar named Lazarus had a difficult time trying to remain alive. He was in need of food, clothing, and medical attention. He died in that condition. The wealthy man who lived in this same locale had everything his heart desired. The only thing the rich man seemed not to feast upon was the Word of God. He also passed from this life.

Death has a unique way of bringing "everyone" to a common level. The rich man now desires to be attended to (wanting Lazarus to cool his tongue with water) by the very one he didn't want to care for while on earth. Religion even becomes important, and he now desires to warn his five brethren lest they suffer his fate.

The answer from Abraham declares that if people wouldn't heed Moses and the prophets neither would they believe one raised from the dead. This principle is still true today. Jesus says, *"And why call ye me, Lord, Lord, and do not the things which I say?" (Luke 6:46)*

It does not seem to matter that God has spoken on these matters and condemned them. It will matter one day -- and they will remember!

God's Word is truth (John 17:17). But it is rejected, neglected, ignored, and conveniently overlooked by many. One day they will indeed remember, but like the rich man -- the memory will only bring anguish and torment for it will then be too late!
