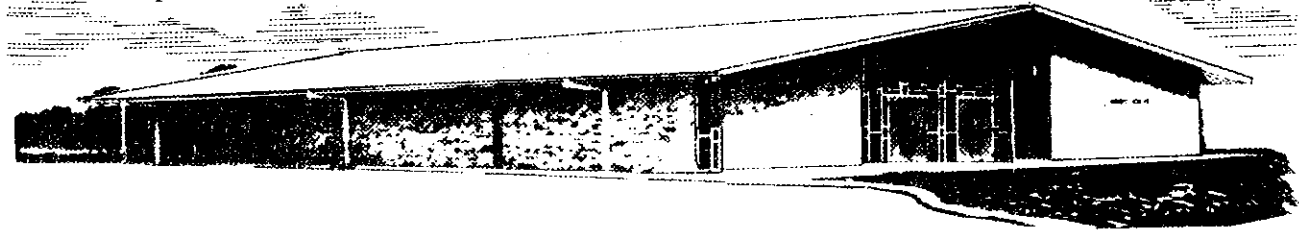

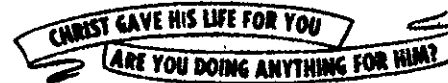

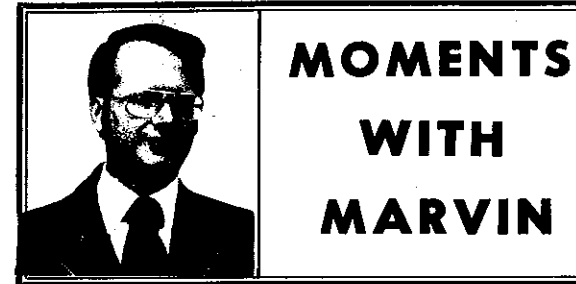

Make every effort to be present this Sunday. You'll be glad you did!

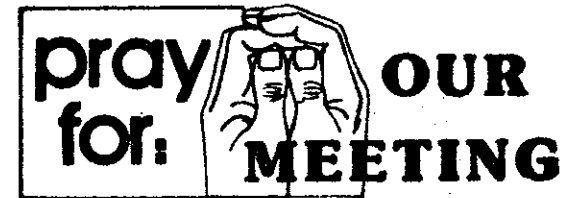
