See you at worship this Sunday!


### **DEACON RESIGNS**

WHAT SUFFERING CAN DO

"God washes the eyes by tears until they can behold the invisible land where tears shall come no more."

-Henry Ward Beecher

There just may be more truth to the above statement than one would like to admit. Bro. Don McWhorter wrote an article that appeared in the February 3, 1972 Gospel Advocate that challenged my thinking in this area, and I want to use a few of his major points in this brief article.

Suffering keeps this world from becoming too attractive! Have you ever considered what your attitude would be if life were problem free? It might make this world so appealing that one would be hard pressed to keep his mind and heart set on heaven. I personally know of several families that live so comfortable in this world that they have lost interest in the one to come. Let us never forget that our Lord can use suffering to remind us of how beautiful heaven really will be. Perhaps our eyes do indeed have to be washed in tears before we can see clearly the land where no tears will exist!

Suffering makes us depend on God! The Creator of this world is still in control even if millions do not live like it. Every good and perfect gift comes from God (James 1:17), and we are in constant need of his blessings. As long as life is relatively problem-free most people feel that they are making it on their own. How many times have you heard someone say, "I'm a self-made man; I've accomplished all this with my own two hands, and by standing on my own two feet." Many times when suffering comes it serves to bring these people to their knees, and provides them with a new and wholesome perspective toward life and living.

Suffering can serve to purify us! We know that our Lord teaches that if our relationship and attitude is right He will hear and answer our prayers. After human hands with God's help have done all that can be done one may search his own life much closer to make sure unforgiven sins are not separating him from the Lord. Our relationship with our fellow-man and the Lord is so very important, and we need to reflect on them much more often than we normally do.

Suffering teaches us how to pray! I'm convinced that most Christians believe in prayer. I am not convinced, however, that the majority of Christians fervently pray to the Father as they should. It may be that the problems and suffering of this life causes one to commune with God much more faithfully than they otherwise would.

Think about what suffering can do. The tears are really worthwhile if they help us see God more clearly!
