### Modesty of Dress

The predominant culture in which we live today does not want to acknowledge that there are differences between men and women. It seeks no obligation from either sex to be one or the other. The Bible clearly contradicts this blatant lie. The Holy Spirit inspired Paul to write to Timothy about the differences between men and women in 1 Timothy 2. Among those differences were how women were to clothe themselves. "In like manner also, that the women adorn themselves in modest apparel, with propriety and moderation, not with braided hair or gold or pearls or costly clothing, but, which is proper for women professing godliness, with good works" (1 Timothy 2:9-10). The godly women will not want to wear clothing that proclaims the authority of self by wearing either ostentatious clothing or lack of clothing.

Peter also wrote about this issue: "Do not let your adornment be merely outward—arranging the hair, wearing gold, or putting on fine apparel— rather let it be the hidden person of the heart, with the incorruptible beauty of a gentle and quiet spirit, which is very precious in the sight of God" (1 Peter 4:3-4). Whose attention does a godly woman want to attract? Man's? or God's? Immodest clothing is designed to attract the attention of man. Modest clothing gives reverence to God. Both Christian men and women have an obligation to encourage their families to wear clothing that will give reverence to God, not their own bodies. The bedroom is the place where married men and women may practice godly personal relationships (Hebrews 13:4). Taking such practices out of the bedroom and putting them on display for the world is sinful. The Christian should have more shame than to take what God has given to share with only one and parade it in front of the world.

### Where do you find it? - Who's got it?

Not so long ago, some items of interest were scarce (tp?). Our consumer society has truly brought about some interesting phenomena. The hunt for usable items in an economy that has "obsoleted" many soundly-engineered products is an irony not lost on us. Recognizing lasting quality or prolonged usability is something that may grow into admiration or wonder. We recognize value sometimes belatedly, even where puchases are concerned. (Anyone care to play "best/worst \$20 I ever spent"?) Certainly, we have demonstrated our ability to forsake reason in our purchase choices. As a race, almost from the very beginning, man has shown his willingness to ignore, shun, put away, procrastinate, forget, and so forth, all the worthwhile instruction and counsel of God.

Jeremiah was told to go and stand in the ways and ask for the old paths. There was an unfortunate, widespread failure to recognize the value of what was being highlighted in his and Ezekiel's day. "They shall not hearken..." "We will not walk therein". Tragedy then is paralleled by our own generation.

The Prophet Amos preached and warned.

Behold, the days come, saith the Lord GOD, that I will send a famine in the land, not a famine of bread, nor a thirst for water, but of hearing the words of the LORD: And they shall wander from sea to sea, and from the north even to the east, they shall run to and fro to seek the word of the LORD, and shall not find it. In that day shall the fair virgins and young men faint for thirst. (Amo 8:11-13)

Timothy was told in the first century. Preach the <u>word</u>. He was urged to remind, reprove, and exhort. People all need instruction from God. It has intrinsic value. Substitutions and perversions (man's "improvements") fail miserably (2 Tim 4; Gal 1), and end in disaster.

Peter acknowledged to our Lord: "Lord, to whom shall we go? Thou hast the words of eternal life?" (John 6:68). Jesus had just laid the claim to value upon his words, "they are spirit, they are life" (v63). For the interested who seek, ask, and knock the path to eternal life—all that is worth having—opens up. Everlasting life is what we get when we drink of the water Jesus gives. It is a fountain open for all!

It's no wonder that Peter uses the figure of the desire shown by newborn babes in their thirst for sustaining milk. The wisdom of Solomon should reside in our hearts, if we will listen to his counsel: "Buy the truth, and sell it not; also wisdom, and instruction, and understanding" (Prov 23:23). We must grow spiritually, else we die. God has our spiritual nutrition all ready for us.
