

## What is Grace? (Part 5)

Another false doctrine about grace that is widely believed today is that one cannot fall from it. This is also known as the "once saved, always saved" doctrine. Does the Bible teach that one cannot fall from grace? In the book of Galatians, Paul wrote to Christians who were being led astray by the false doctrine that gentiles were required to keep the Law of Moses. This doctrine came from Pharisees who had become Christians (Acts 15:5). Paul wrote a letter to the churches of Galatia and told them not to believe this. He said regarding those who did, "You have become estranged from Christ, you who attempt to be justified by law; you have fallen from grace" (Galatians 5:4). What does this mean? The Christian's salvation is not unconditionally guaranteed by God. Rather, God promises salvation so long as the Christian remains faithful. Those who choose to leave Christianity will not retain their salvation. This was the whole point of the book of Hebrews, which was written to Christians being tempted to return to Judaism. Some already had, and in Hebrews 6:4-6 (ASV), the Bible says, "For as touching those who were once enlightened and tasted of the heavenly gift, and were made partakers of the Holy Spirit, and tasted the good word of God, and the powers of the age to come, and then fell away, it is impossible to renew them again unto repentance; seeing they crucify to themselves the Son of God afresh, and put him to an open shame." Jesus said to the saints at Smyrna, "Be thou faithful unto death, and I will give thee the crown of life" (Revelation 2:10). One cannot abandon Christianity and expect to be saved. Jesus will only save those who hear His voice and follow Him (John 10:27).

## "Doest thou well to be angry?"

In the King James Version of the Bible, the exact phrase "in his anger" occurs six times, all in the Old Testament, and always referring to the anger of the LORD. Men may be stirred to anger irrationally, on the basis of emotion, as the result of injured pride, or because of some merely perceived insult or injury. However, God knows all things. He is never deceived, and cannot be. When He is angry and wrathful in the Bible, and His character is being revealed to us, it demonstrates just HOW wrong a thing is or was. Sin is to be taken seriously. When the Creator expends HIS time and resources to deal with trespasses of men, He intends us to learn from the whole scenario. As His wrath was poured out on the people of Sodom and Gomorrha, Admah and Zeboim (Deuteronomy 29:23) we ought to see a need to avert such disasters, find a path to avoid such, and strive to always remember and teach others about such things.

Truly, the anger of the LORD is great against the wicked, the rebellious, the slothful, the immoral and the insincere. We are not left wondering how God feels about these things. See Genesis 6-8, Leviticus 10; Numbers 13-14; Joshua 7; 2 Samuel 11-12. It takes some very irrational rationalizations of men to arrive at incorrect conclusions about these types of things. God made it clear how serious sin is by showing wrath against specific things on specific occasions.

One of the most relevant-to-our-day rationalizations putting people in the path of God's wrath has to do with the elevation of government-defined & -protected "rights" above that which is matter of morality. Whether we are talking about fornication or abortion, these issues have the same character and consequences. God hates divorce. God condemns and forbids murder. God punishes those who will not repent despite His warnings and forbearance (Acts 17:30,31).

The final manifestation of the wrath of God when Jesus comes again. (2 Thessalonians 1:7-9) will provide unparalleled clarity for mankind. All will finally see and know what it is to "meet their maker". All of man's self-defense mechanisms will be stripped away (Matthew 25) and all will have to contend with God's truth. (2 Peter 3:3-12). It can be difficult to contend with irrational and angry people, but there is absolutely no resisting an angry God (Hebrews 10:29-31; 12:29). jp
