The Gospel of Peace

"Therefore I exhort first of all that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and giving of thanks be made for all men, for kings and all who are in authority, that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and reverence" (1 Timothy 2:1-4).

The apostle Paul teaches us that one purpose to prayer is so that "we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and reverence." A good Christian wants peace with others (Romans 12:18). This peace gives us the opportunity to practice godliness and reverence. Physical disruptions, such as famine, war, violence, and disease, distract from daily Christian living. The good life is the quiet and peaceable life showered by God's blessings of family and friends who assemble as Christians to worship.

Jesus said, "The thief does not come except to steal, and to kill, and to destroy. I have come that they may have life, and that they may have it more abundantly" (John 10:10). God gives the good life, but Satan wants to take it away. His chief tool is sin, and he uses it to disrupt, disturb, and destroy. Recently, I was "cussed out" by someone. It was unnerving to be the object of such hatred and wrath, and it reminded me how good I have it most days. I know that some Christians endure such treatment regularly. It's sad, but it reinforces the need for the gospel. Paul goes on to tell Timothy in 1 Timothy 2:5, "For this is good and acceptable in the sight of God our Savior, who desires all men to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth" (1 Timothy 2:3-4). The solution to the sin problem is the gospel. If you want more people to live in peace, preach the gospel to them.

Indelibly Impressed

According to Webster's Dictionary of American English of 1828, the adverb *Indelibly* is defined as "In a manner not to be blotted out or effaced; too deeply imprinted to be effaced, or to vanish." Proverbs 22:6 says that we should train up children in the way they should go, and when they are old, they will not depart from it. Ephesians 6 also commands that fathers should bring up their children in the nurture and admonition of the Lord. Parents in particular have a great responsibility toward their children, but we all do have an influence upon the little ones who watch us. Some are more impressionable than others, so it behooves us to weigh our actions carefully. Regardless of methods, mistakes, and messes, our responsibilities do not change.

Deuteronomy 6:7 gives God's command to the Israelites: "And thou shalt teach them (these words, that I command thee this day, vs 6 jp) diligently unto thy children. . . ." The Hebrew word for "teach" used here means "whet" or "sharpen". Our efforts like theirs are hands-on when it comes to getting our children to grow in knowledge and eventually in faith. It makes sense that if we want them to be individuals who have the relationship with God that He wants, we must impart to them what He expects of us. His commands, the truths of the Scriptures, and the ways we please Him certainly fall under the scope of what we can pass on to others, especially our children and sometimes grandchildren. Young Daniel and his friends had been taught (Daniel 1) well enough so that even in captivity, with the loss of elements of stability (homes and acquaintances), they still stood up for what was right. It had been indelibly impressed upon them. They couldn't forget about it. They wouldn't forget about it. The facts show in Daniel's record that God was pleased with them. It encourages us all. jp
