The Cross or the Consumer?

Many people today choose a church based on what they like. "Go to the church of your choice," is a popular saying. They pick a church like they choose a flavor of ice cream. This one is vanilla. That one is chocolate. They reason: "I may choose whatever flavor suits me because ice cream is all the same: sugar, milk, and cream. The additional flavoring is merely a matter of personal taste." That thinking goes something like this: "All churches preach the same morality, Jesus, and Bible. Therefore, I may choose whatever church suits my fancy." This is the consumerist decision process of wanting something (a toaster, bank, cup of coffee, etc.), finding what we like, and getting it. Is that how to "pick a church?"

Many churches tap into this consumerism. They design "worship" around the shopper—offering a rock concert-like experience. They have a motivational speaker to make people feel good. They segregate children's worship to "give parents a break." It's what the consumer likes.

What if church isn't about the consumer? What if it isn't about personal preference? What if churches don't preach the same morality, Jesus, or Bible? What if "picking a church" was about something other than "me." What if "picking a church" means picking the cross?

When Jesus says, "Not my will, but thine be done" (Luke 22:42), is that about pleasing the masses? When the Savior washes the disciples' dirty, nasty, filthy toes (John 13:2-17), is that about personal preference? When you see God take the form of a slave (Philippians 2:5-8), is the church about "your choice?" When an innocent Man dies on the cross for the sins of the world (John 20), is that about the "experience of worship?" Should consumerism form the church or should the cross?

Got all your Ducks in a Row?

Jesus taught his disciples to <u>watch</u> regarding the Judgment. He taught that we should get ready and try to stay in a state of readiness for His return (Matthew 24:42f: Mark 13:33-37). Another phrase that is used for being ready to "meet our Maker" upon His return or our death is used in the Bible: "Set thy house in order"! (2 Samuel 17:23; 2 Kings 20:1; Isaiah 38:1). Sometimes we use similar phrases, like "get your ducks in a row".

Since it will be the case that when Jesus comes again, those who obey not the Gospel will receive of the wrath of God, we can easily see *that (obedience)* is mandatory, crucial, and essential to "be ready" (2 Thessalonians 1:7-9).

What needs to be done in order for us to be ready? How can we get ready? God tells us in 2 Corinthians 5:10 "We must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, that every one may receive the things done in his body, according to that he hath done, whether good or bad." Mark 16:16 and Hebrews 11:6 both make it clear that one must have faith in God. We must believe that He is, and He is a rewarder of those that diligently seek Him.

While it is also made clear in Hebrews 9:27 it is appointed unto man once to die, and after this cometh the judgment, Paul further enlightens us in Acts 17 regarding the judgment of mankind by that man who "He [God] hath ordained". The urgency comes through very well in Acts as Paul addressed some in Athens on Mars' Hill. Repent! (v.30)

There's no wiggle room or any gray area regarding the commands and instructions of God from Matthew 10:32-33 and Romans 10:9-10. We <u>must confess</u> Jesus as the Son of God, just as the eunuch demonstrated in Acts 8.

Many times over the books of Acts gives accounts of those who were converted. They believed, repented, confessed, and were baptized (Acts 2:38-42; 3:19ff; 16: 15,33; 22:16, etc). So these people obeyed the instructions (Gospel– good news) they were told. We do the same 2000 years later to access the blood of Christ, obtain the forgiveness of sins, and "get all our ducks in a row" jp
